

YELLOW-BILLED CUCKOO

Coccyzus americanus

non-breeding visitor, vagrant

monotypic

Yellow-billed Cuckoos breed throughout most of North America S to n. Mexico and the West Indies, and withdraw in winter to n. S America (AOU 1998). Vagrants have been recorded in Europe (Cramp and Simmons 1985), Clipperton I (Howell et al. 1993), and once in the *Northwestern Hawaiian Islands*, where one was well observed, described, and distantly but diagnostically photographed at *Laysan* 1 Nov 1994 ([HRBP](#) 1070-1071). Populations of W North America, perhaps the most likely origin for the Laysan individual, have been considered a separate subspecies ("*C.a. occidentalis*") but we here consider the species monotypic (cf. Pyle 1997).
