New Hawaiian Plants.—IV.

Lysimachia koolauensis, nom. nov.

L. longisepala Forbes, in Occasional Papers, B. P. B. M., IV, 222 (1909) not Forrest, in Notes Roy. Bot. Gard. Edin. XIX, 237 (1908).

On consulting the latest supplement to the Index Kewensis, which was not previously available, I find that the above change of name is necessary, as the name long isepala was preoccupied for a Chinese plant by Forrest. As more extensive field collecting has not extended the range of this plant beyond the Koolau range of mountains on Oahu, it seems appropriate that the plant should bear this name. A point not mentioned in the original description is that it often has a creeping rhizome.
